Community Service



What are community service hours?

The Ashley Athletic Honor Society (AAHS) requires student-athletes to volunteer for organizations that rely heavily on volunteers for their success. Community service hours are the amount of time a student-athlete is involved in activities for which he or she receives no compensation. The student participates in these activities as a volunteer and with a “positive, courteous, and enthusiastic spirit.” All hours must be earned and supervised by the organization or activity coordinator. Community service hours performed for the sole purpose of earning a trip, prize, or other non-monetary reward may not be included in the student’s application to AAHS.

How many service hours do I need for membership in AAHS?

For prospective members, a minimum of four community service hours are needed for admission to AAHS for each school year. All athletes must commit to at least four service hours per year (minimum of 24 hours during four years of high school). The good news is by living in the New Hanover County, student-athletes have many opportunities to participate in service-related projects, organizations, and activities.

Citizenship and Character

Standards of Good Character and Citizenship

All eligible student-athletes will be evaluated by the staff and/or administration according to the standards of the AAHS. Student-athletes shall be suspension free, punctual, ethical and model appropriate behavior.

Participation

Student –Athletes shall participate in interscholastic athletics (in good standing with one sport each year) all four years of high school. The student-athlete must letter in a varsity sport their junior and senior year.

Academics

The student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 (weighted) after seven semesters of high school and be on pace to graduate. Grade point average will not be rounded to meet the minimum requirement.

All senior members in good standing will be recognized and receive an honor cord (Garnet & Gold) at the Senior Athletic Excellence Banquet at the end of each academic year.
