2024-2025 PREVIEW

Outlook: The Tigers' season ended with a close call, 79-76 in double overtime, at the Fieldhouse in Canton vs. McKinley.

Since then, they took a hit to their scoring potential with senior guard Braylyn Irby transferring to Glenville, but big forward Jay'Quan Stubbs could still play despite his football commitment to Minnesota.

One certainty is this: Cleveland Heights will bring a deep squad, and coach J.R. Bremer still has a quartet returning senior guards with Bryce Darden, Iyan Bremer and Carter Armstrong to go with 6-5 forward Jaymen Allen.

The Tigers will make what is now becoming an annual, post-Christmas trip to the Phoenix area to participate in the Cactus Jam High School Basketball Showcase.

This season the Tigers are grouped in the 'Cactus' Division and will play teams from Arizona, Washington, Oregon and Alaska during the five-day trip to Arizona.

Other non-conference games played locally will also test the Tigers early in the season.

Heights will play both Lutheran East and Garfield Heights before holiday trip to Phoenix. The Bulldogs advanced to the regional championship game last season and the Falcons captured the Division III state championship.

Cleveland Heights will play one of the most challenging conference schedules in the state. The Greater Cleveland Conference features four other teams ranked in the Top 20 of the preseason cleveland.com poll.

Cleveland Heights, plus Brunswick, Mentor, Medina and Strongsville all finished above 500 in the GCC a year ago. Mentor won the conference and Brunswick advanced to the Elite 8 in Division I in March.

CLEVELAND HEIGHTS TIGERS COACHING STAFF

J.R. Bremer is back home again.

In May, the 1999 Cleveland Heights graduate was hired as the boys basketball coach at his alma mater. Bremer won a state title as a sophomore in 1997 with the Tigers under legendary coach Jim Capelletti. His No. 22 jersey is retired.

Bremer (born September 19, 1980) is a former professional basketball player who last played for Limoges CSP of the LNB Pro A.

Bremer attended St. Bonaventure and went on to play in the NBA, including a stint with the Cleveland Cavaliers, and was an NBA All-Rookie second team member. He also represented the senior men's Bosnia and Herzegovina national basketball team and was one of the highest-paid point guards in Europe in 2008.

In 2002, Bremer attended the NBA Chicago pre-draft camp and tested as the number one tested athlete. Although Bremer went undrafted, he signed as an undrafted free agent with the NBA's Boston Celtics in 2002, and in that season he was named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team. He spent two seasons in the NBA, with the Celtics (2002-03), the Cleveland Cavaliers (2003-04), and the Golden State Warriors (2003-04), averaging 6.5 points and 2.2 assists per game. He became known as a 3-point specialist. The Charlotte Bobcats selected him from the Warriors in the NBA expansion draft, and then waived him shortly thereafter.

Since 2004, he has played in Europe, competing for the following clubs: Málaga of the Spanish League where he won the Spanish King's Cup. He played for Biella and Olimpia Milano of the Italian League, PAOK of the Greek League, Bosna of the Bosnia and Herzegovina League, Spartak Primorje of the Russian Super League, Triumph Lyubertsy, Krasnye Krylya Samara and Nizhny Novgorod of the Russian Pro League, and Fenerbahçe Ülker of the Turkish League.

In 2009, he signed a contract with Krasnye Krylya Samara of the Russian Super League. In July 2011, he signed a contract with BC Nizhny Novgorod. In January 2012, Bremer moved to the Italian Serie A team Olimpia Milano. Later that year, he signed a contract with Fenerbahçe Ülker. In December 2012, Bremer left Fenerbahçe Ülker and returned to his former club Emporio Armani Milano. For the 2013-14 season he signed with Royal Halı Gaziantep.

On December 5, 2014, Bremer signed with his former team PAOK Thessaloniki.

In January 2015, he left PAOK and returned to Turkey where he signed with Torun Konyaspor. In May 2015, after the end of the 2014-15 Turkish League season, he returned to PAOK for the Greek playoffs. On July 30, 2015, he returned to Torun Konyaspor. On April 19, 2016, he parted ways with Konyaspor.

On December 28, 2016, Bremer signed with Limoges CSP.

Bremer last served as a volunteer coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

Andre Scott (Director of Operations) - Scott has been with the Cleveland Heights program for the past 10 seasons and is serving as the Director of Operations & Assistant Coach for the program for the second season.

Troy Coleman - Coach Coleman enters his seventh year as an Assistant Coach at Cleveland Heights. He worked on Coach Cruz's Massillon staff previous to joining the Tigers coaching staff.

Mark Chapman - Coach "Sweets" begins his 10th season in the program on the high school level. He previously coached four years for the Heights middle schools.

Chris Lewis - Coach Lewis is entering his fourth year as the program's boy's freshman coach. He loves working with the kids and is very big on player development. Lewis is also one of our main coaches when it comes to strength and conditioning.

NEW DIVISIONS FROM OHSAA; SMALLER DIVISION I

The Ohio High School Athletic Association Board of Directors voted earlier in February to expand postseason play in seven sports.

Boys and girls basketball were included in the expansion, along with baseball, softball and volleyball will expand from four divisions to seven. Boys and girls soccer will expand from three divisions to five.

Under the new format for each sport, the largest 64 schools will compete in Division I and the next 64 largest schools will compete in Division II, with the rest of the schools distributed between the remaining divisions as evenly as possible.

The new structure begins with this season - and as a result of the newly aligned Division, the smallest school in Division I boys basketball this season will be Thomas Worthington with an adjusted enrollment, including competitive balance, of 625 boys.

Cleveland Heights is the smallest Division I school in Northeast Ohio with an adjusted enrollment of 630, while defending state champion St. Ignatius is the biggest at 1,371 (adjusted with competitive balance from a base enrollment of 1,039 boys).

OHSAA Executive Director Doug Ute praised the board's decision as a step toward to level the playing field of OHSAA tournaments, including boys basketball.

"It's the right thing to do for the student-athletes who have been competing at this disadvantage," Ute said. "For too long, the largest schools in our divisions have been so much larger than the smaller schools in the same division, which has resulted in many schools accepting that they realistically have little chance at making a run in the tournament.

"With our four division model, we have 190-plus teams in a division," Ute said in February after initially announcing the change. "That's off the chart nationally compared to what other states have."

JAYQUAN STUBBS - BIG 10 BOUND

Cleveland Heights two-sport athlete, JayQuan Stubbs, says the University of Minnesota "checks all the boxes". Stubbs officially signed his letter of intent in early December to continue his playing career with the Golden Gophers.

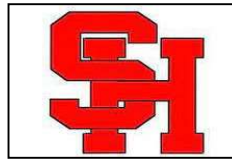
In June, the three-star recruit, verbally committed to play football next season for Minnesota, choosing Gophers over Wisconsin, West Virginia, Indiana and Kentucky.

Stubbs has an imposing physical football frame; he is 6-foot-6, 275 pounds, and has an 82 inch wingspan. Gophers football staff say, Stubbs moves very well for an athlete with his size.. Stubbs continues to impress the staff as they believe he is cut from the same mold as former Minnesota defensive end Ezezi Otomewo (Jacksonville Jaguars), with the body, length, and athleticism the Gophers covet in a strongside defensive end.

Stubbs could also very well have a NFL ceiling (much like Otomewo), but the coaching staff has reminded him that he will need to continue refining his technique as a pass rusher.

Former Tigers football head coach, Mac Stephens, is a graduate of the University of Minnesota.

TIGERS IN THE BACKCOURT (Previous Game)



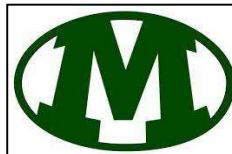
