Less than 90 seconds into the 2024 season, Cleveland Heights was on the scoreboard for the first time as running back Marquise Davis found the end zone.

Heights made that first-quarter TD run by Davis hold up as the Tigers shut out the Rams, 6-0, including a goal line stand with nine minutes remaining in the game.

Opening Drive

Bryce Jones is back at his alma mater as the new head coach of the Cleveland Heights Tigers.

Jones takes over for Mac Stephens, who has moved on to Garfield Heights.

The offense the last several years ran through Marquise Davis, now at Missouri, after becoming an All-Ohio Mr. Football finalist as a junior. He played through injury last season, which opened opportunities for then-freshmen Elijah Harris and John Morris.

Both are back as sophomores with Henry Perrymond, who expects to play an enhanced role at receiver with returning quarterback Asher Wilson and junior transfer LaMarques Greenwood II, who played last year at Glenville.

Trotwood-Madison went 5-6 last season, including a 6-0 loss to the Tigers in Week 1 of 2024. The Rams started 0-5 before winning five straight and losing to Hamilton Badin in the postseason.

They are perennially a threat in Division II and can not be overlooked with talent on both sides of the ball.

Chalk Talk with Head Coach Bryce Jones

I'm excited to be back at Heights High and at a place that gave me so much. Being able to continue to represent the black and gold is an honor and we instill that in our kids daily.

I'm proud of the work our guys put in this pre-season and look forward to building on the foundation we have established.

Head Coach Jeff Graham

Jeff Graham was named head coach of Trotwood-Madison prior to the 2020 season. Graham spent the previous six years as the offensive coordinator for the Rams. Graham is a Kettering Alter graduate, earned All Big 10 honors as a wide receiver at Ohio State and played 11 seasons in the NFL. Graham was selected in the 2nd round of the 1991 NFL draft by Pittsburgh, playing for the Steelers, Bears, Jets, Eagles and Chargers during his career. He caught 31 touchdowns and had more than 8,000 receiving yards in the NFL.

2024 - Season Review and Recap

TIGERS STRUGGLED WITH KEY INJURIES THROUGHOUT THE SEASON, EXITED THE POST SEASON IN RD 1

Cleveland Heights finished 6-5 in 2024 under Coach Mac Stephens, who has since left the program.

Two of the losses were to Strongsville, including the season-ending playoff defeat in which injuries played a big part.

Running back Marquise Davis, who is now at Missouri, was a Mr. Football candidate all season.

Elijah Harris came in for the injured Davis as a freshman and averaged 6.5 yards per carry with over 600 yards for the season.

After a 2-4 start to the year, the Tigers won four in a row to easily get into the postseason in Division I, Region 1 as the No. 9 seed.

The Cleveland Heights-University Heights City School District selected Bryce Jones in January 2025, to serve as head football coach for Heights High School and dean of students at Oxford Elementary School.

Jones is a 2012 Cleveland Heights High School graduate, where he played quarterback and defensive back and ran track for four years. In 2012, he was named the Lake Erie League MVP for both football and track.

During his senior season on the football field, he recorded 1,388 yards and 12 touchdowns passing, and ran for another 350 yards and seven touchdowns on the ground. On defense, Jones tallied 27 tackles, six pass breakups and two interceptions. Jones also served as the Tigers punter.

As a member of the Tigers track team, Jones was the 2012 state indoor track long jump champion and an All Ohio athlete in the in the 110-meter hurdles and the long jump for the outdoor track season. Jones currently holds the school record in the 110-meter hurdles and the long jump.

GCC Expanding

The Greater Cleveland Conference sought to add an eighth school since Solon officially left the GCC in 2023 (except for football) for the Suburban League.

In May of 2023, the conference found that school - Lorain High School – and made an official offer for the Titans to join the conference.

The Titans, a division I school, begins its tenure in the GCC for the start of this school year (2025-26 school year). Lorain is departing from the Lake Erie League.

This marks the second expansion of the GCC specifically pulling schools from the LEL. To start the 2023-24 school year, the GCC added Cleveland Heights and Shaker Heights from the LEL, joining charter GCC members Mentor, Brunswick, Euclid, Medina, and Strongsville.

The addition of Lorain to the conference also had another domino effect. The Lake Erie League, home to the Tigers for more than 100 years has dissolved as a result of declining in conference team.

All five current team in the LEL will play an independent schedule for the 2025 schedule.

For the 2026-2027 school year, the Greater Cleveland Conference will swap out teams, and maintain the conference membership at eight teams.

Medina High School has elected to leave the GCC and join the Suburban League.

The Bees, a charter member of the new-version of the GCC since 2015, accepted the invite from the Suburban League in November, 2024.

The move to the Suburban League is part of a broader realignment. Medina, along with Kenston and Mayfield, will join the SL to enhance stability after Kent Roosevelt, Cuyahoga Falls and Tallmadge depart for the Metro Athletic Conference at the conclusion of the 2025-26 school year.

Four months later in March, 2025, the Greater Cleveland Conference invited Riverside to become the eighth member of the conference for the 2026-2027 school year.

Riverside will replace the Medina Bees, in a conference that includes school in four different counties (Cuyahoga, Lake, Lorain and Medina).

Riverside joining the GCC completes the demise of the Western Reserve Conference.

Mayfield and Kenston are joining the Suburban League in an expansion that also included former GCC school Medina.

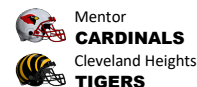
In February, North, South and Chardon announced the schools were joining the Chagrin Valley Conference.

Cleveland Heights - Overtime Games

The Cleveland Heights Tigers have played ONE overtime game in the last 30 years

The Tigers defeated the Mentor Cardinals 14-13 on Sept. 15, 2023

Junior E'mere Atkins scored on a two-point conversion run in the first overtime, overtaking the Cardinals who had taken a 13-6 lead prior to the Tigers possession in extra session. John Gordon scored on a four-yard run to bring the Tigers within a point prior to the two-point try.

This victory ended a 20-game losing streak for Cleveland Heights against Mentor, who had not defeated the Cardinals since 1980.

Overall, the Tigers have played in 9 overtime games since the OHSAA allowed teams to play overtime games (by team and conferences starting in 1985; officially an OHSAA rule in 1991)

Cleveland Heights is 5-4 in overtime games. The Tigers have won three of their last four extra-session games.

Cleveland Hts Class of 1945 - Impact On Sports World

Charles Dolan

1945 Cleveland Hts HS Graduate. Dolan founded Home Box Office (HBO), and founded the first company to wire apartment buildings in NYC for cable television. Dolan founded Cablevision, a cable company that expanded to include the creations of the AMC Networks. Dolan sold the company in 2017 for over \$17 billion. Dolan is also a majority owner of the Madison Square Garden networks and the Madison Square Garden Companies, which are the corporate owners of the New York Knicks, the New York Rangers, and the New York Liberty (WNBA). Charles Dolan's nephew Paul (son of Charles' younger brother Larry) is the current owners of the Cleveland Guardians.

Bert Wolstein

1945 Cleveland Hts HS Graduate. Wolstein was an American real estate developer, sports team owner, and philanthropist. He founded Developers Diversified Realty Corporation, developing shopping centers in the United States. In 1979, he purchased the Cleveland Force in the MISL. Wolstein made a bid for the Cleveland Browns during the summer of 1997 - three investment groups were vying for the new Cleveland franchise - Wolstein; eventual owner, Al Lerner; and Wolstein's high school classmate, Charles Dolan. Following his death in 2004, his widow, Iris, donated \$6.5 million to Cleveland State University, which renamed it's on campus arena the Bert & Iris Wolstein Center.

1959 American Football League officially named at a meeting in Dallas, Texas; charter members Dallas, New York, Houston, Denver, Los Angeles and Minneapolis-Saint Paul.

Minneapolis would withdraw from the league a year later, as the NFL promises the city an NFL expansion team.

The league adds Buffalo, Boston and Oakland before the league holds its first game on Sept. 8, 1960.

The Boston Patriots, Buffalo Bills, Houston Oilers and New York Titans are assigned to the Eastern Division. The Dallas Texans (who in 1963 moved to Kansas City as the Chiefs), Denver Broncos, Los Angeles Chargers and Oakland Raiders.
