

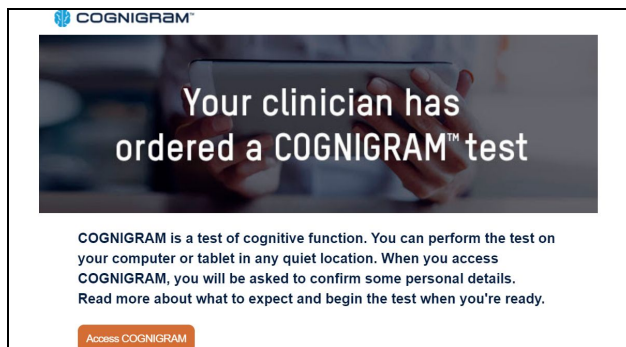
COGNIGRAM - Concussion Baseline
Football & Volleyball

Football and Volleyball 9th grade, 11th grade, and new-to-sport athletes take a computerized concussion baseline exam prior to the start of the season on school grounds. **This exam is kept on file to be used, among other assessments, to assist a student athlete to return-to-play post concussion.** This year, these exams will take place in front of your own device at home. The Anderson Athletic Trainers have created profiles for each athlete and will order exams for them and a link will be sent to their parent's/guardian's email address the week of August 24th. This exam must be completed prior to September 8th.

***This exam is for your student athlete to take themselves.
It is recommended to be in a quiet room free from distractions to take the exam.***

Parents/guardians: Be on a lookout for an email from healthcaresupport@cogstate.com with the subject line: **"A COGNIGRAM test has been ordered for you"**
