Why Interscholastic Athletics & OHSAA Beliefs

- Participation in interscholastic athletics programs is educational in nature and:
 - Complements your school experience.
 - Fosters a sense of community and teaches lifelong lessons of hard work, teamwork, citizenship and discipline.
 - Promotes a lifetime appreciation for sports and healthy lifestyles.
 - Helps prepare you for the next level of your life as a responsible adult and productive citizen.



Why Interscholastic Athletics & OHSAA Beliefs

- Participation in interscholastic athletics programs:
 - ...is a privilege, not a right.
 - ...is not designed to prepare you for the next level of sports. Rather, it allows students to engage in a well-rounded experience that includes participation in a multitude of extracurricular activities.
 - ...implements educational components of participation in interscholastic athletics programs.
 - ...promotes student academic achievement and success over athletics achievement and success.



Required to Participate

A. Final Forms Registration by the parent/guardian and student

*This online registration platform will have all the required paperwork



B. OHSAA Physical Evaluation

No athlete will be able to participate until ALL proper documentation is completed and on file in the athletic office.

All forms can be found in the Athletic Office.



OHSAA Eligibility



High School

1. Must have passed five (5) one credit courses, or their equivalent, in the preceding grading period
2. Can not have failed more than one class in the preceding grading period
3. Must have a 1.2 GPA or higher in the preceding grading period
4. Age requirement: 20 years old = Ineligible Immediately

Middle School

1. Must have passing grades in a minimum of four (4) subjects in the preceding grading period
*All courses in which a student receives a grade count toward eligibility
2. Age Requirement: 15 years old = Ineligible Immediately for Middle School athletics

DO NOT DROP OR CHANGE CLASSES without checking with guidance office!

CCP Athletes

CCP Students are required to submit weekly grades by 3:00 pm each Thursday.

Weekly Eligibility



High School

1. Athletic Office will pull grades to provide to head coaches each Thursday. Students have until 3:30 pm on Friday to submit updated grades.

*Student-Athletes must be passing five (5) one credit courses or their equivalent to participate the following week.

*Student-Athletes must not be failing more than one class and meet the above requirement.

Middle School

1. Middle School secretaries will pull grades Friday morning.

*Student-Athletes must be passing five (5) subjects.

*Student-Athletes must not be failing more than one class and meet the above requirement.

Failure to meet Weekly Eligibility Requirements will result in denial of participation for the following week (midnight Saturday to midnight Saturday)

Attendance Guidelines

Attendance Requirements for Participating in Extra-Curricular Activities

For a student to be eligible to participate in an extra-curricular activity, including meetings, field trips, practices, or contests, the student must attend a minimum of four (4) class periods (exclusive of lunch period) during the school day, AND any period missed must be missed due to an excused absence. Permission to participate due to extenuating circumstances may be approved by the principal.

Transportation Waiver Form

It is expected of the school that students ride school transportation to and from ALL contests.

In approved situations, the Athletic Transportation Waiver Form may be used to provide alternate transportation. The form must be signed by the parent/guardian and submitted to the coach before leaving. Students may only ride with a parent/guardian.

This form is available in the Athletic Office.

Important Eligibility Fact!

During the sports season, you may not participate on a non-school team in the same sport in which you are participating for the school.

If you participate in anything (i.e., try-outs, practices, open gyms, etc) during the sport season, you will be **INELIGIBLE!**

Sportsmanship

When you attend an athletic event, home or away, you are representing the Greenville Community, Greenville City Schools, and our athletes.

Good sportsmanship is a clear quality of good character.

Be a good role model for our children.

Encourage your children to take personal responsibility of situations.

Chain on Command

1. Player --- Coach
2. Parent (w/ player) --- Coach
3. Parent (w/ coach) --- AD and/or Principal
4. Parent (w/ AD and Coach) --- Superintendent
5. Parent --- Board of Education

Communication is KEY!!!

Appropriate Conversations

- The treatment of your child mentally & physically
- Ways to help your child improve
- Concerns about your child's behavior

Inappropriate Conversations

- Playing time
- Team strategy
- Play calling
- Other student-athletes

NAME • IMAGE • LIKENESS

- What is NIL?

- The use of self publicity due to public recognition (athletic fame) and/or the notoriety a student may attain to receive a benefit **through appearances, licensing, social media, endorsements and/or the use of branding.**

- What **isn't** NIL?

- Pay for play!
- OHSAA Bylaw 4-10 still prohibits students from receiving compensation based on their participation or finish in athletic contests.

NAME • IMAGE • LIKENESS

- What criteria must an NIL agreement abide by? (Bylaw 4-11-2)
 - Student does not utilize OHSAA or school logos, names, mascots, trademarks, or other proprietary marks during promotions.
 - Agreements may not be provided by schools or agents of schools (i.e. Boosters, Collectives, Foundations, Coaches, etc.).
 - Student does not engage in NIL activity during school hours or during team activities, including travel to and from events.
 - Agreement may not be based on athletic performance.
 - Student may not be induced to attend a specific school based on an NIL deal.

NAME • IMAGE • LIKENESS

- What criteria must an NIL agreement abide by? (Bylaw 4-11-2)
 - Student may not display the company's logo or product during team activities.
 - Student may not provide benefits to the school or team with which he/she is participating.
 - Agreement does not involve gambling, alcoholic beverages, tobacco, cannabis, banned or illegal substances, adult entertainment products or services, firearms or other weapons.
 - Student is responsible for determining effect on college eligibility.

NAME • IMAGE • LIKENESS

- A student engaged in an NIL deal must disclose the terms of the agreement to the OHSAA within 14 days of the execution of the contract.
 - Failure to do so will result in a period of ineligibility up to 20% of the current sports season.
 - Visit <https://www.ohsaa.org/Eligibility/NIL-Resource-Center> for more information on how to report the deal to the OHSAA.
- Students and families are encouraged to seek professional advice, understand contracts thoroughly and prioritize academic and athletic commitments. These activities should be regarded as a business, and students should stay compliant with school and state regulations and focus on building a strong support system to avoid mismanagement of funds and protect future opportunities.

NAME • IMAGE • LIKENESS

- Final Notes:
 - Students are prohibited from entering into agreements with athlete agents, as defined within ORC 4771.01. (Bylaw 4-10-2f)
 - Students whose transfer can be reasonably linked to an NIL deal may be subject to more severe penalties than the general transfer consequence.
 - It is not the responsibility of school coaches or administrators to secure agreements for student athletes.

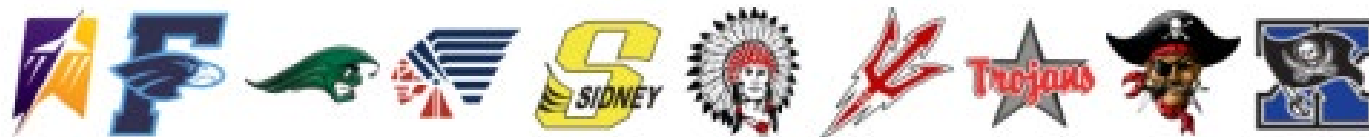
