




Yesterday



Randolph High School was granted a charter by the State of Ohio in 1903. The first school building was in what became known as the Tietzmann building. Growth continued for Randolph schools and the Tietzmann building could no longer accommodate the growing school population. In 1924, a new Randolph High School building was completed to take care of the growing number of students. The new Northmont High School opened in the fall of 1959, and the old Randolph High School became the new junior high school. The building later became O.R. Edgington Elementary School. In 2015, the building was demolished as part of an Ohio Facilities Construction Commission partnership to build new school buildings.





Phillipsburg High School was organized in 1906 with classes held in the township hall. In 1919, land from Montgomery, Darke, and Miami counties became the Phillipsburg Consolidated School District. A new building was built and served Phillipsburg until the new Northmont High School opened in 1959. The existing building became Phillipsburg Elementary School. The school was closed in 2009 in a district cost-saving measure and sold.

In 1944, talk began about additional consolidation of schools. A plan was suggested for Randolph, Clayton, Phillipsburg, and Brookville to join into one large school district with a new complex of buildings to be built in a central location. Brookville voters rejected the concept and the consolidation of the others became a reality in 1957. The new Board of Education purchased a 55-acre farm at the corner of Crestway and National Roads. A contest was held among the school children to name the new district and Patty Bowser won with the name Northmont, which is a contraction of North Montgomery County. It was decided to use the Phillipsburg mascot, "Thunderbolts," and the school colors of Randolph, kelly green and white. The transition was completed and Northmont High School opened in the 1959-60 school year.

Being named to the Northmont Athletic Hall of Fame is the highest honor that can be awarded to former athletes, coaches, administrators, or boosters by the Northmont Athletic Department.

The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to honor individuals who have made lasting and significant contributions to the Northmont Athletic Department and perpetuated the spirit of pride and loyalty that is a cornerstone of the Northmont community.

Candidates' qualifications must possess the following criteria: 1) Nominees must have been Student/Athletes of Phillipsburg, Randolph, or Northmont High Schools; 2) Nominees must have distinguished themselves as a member of the Northmont coaching staff; 3) Nominees must have distinguished themselves in the area of administration; or 4) Nominees must have been a dedicated fan of the Northmont athletic program. All candidates must have been out of school for at least 10 years.

The volunteer selection committee makes nominations and considers those received from alumni and the community. Members can nominate anyone from any era. Nominations must be submitted by March 1 of the preceding year. Nominations are researched and discussed, and a final list of candidates is then presented along with a detailed biography. Post high school athletic achievement, be it college, pro, or amateur, is not a consideration.

The committee sets no quotas by sex, sport, school, or era. Members are unbiased and fair-minded. Also, the committee is sworn to strict confidentiality of all discussions resulting from this process so as to protect the candidates and maintain the highest standard of integrity.

The Hall of Fame Committee accepts nominations at any time. Nominators should provide as much detail as possible as to why they believe the candidate is worthy of induction. Nomination does not assure induction, only consideration. All nominations are archived and discussed with diligence. It is also recognized that a process such as this is not perfect. Given the number of schools, years, and candidates, it is possible for a worthy candidate to be overlooked. This is why community and alumni nominations are highly encouraged.



Athletic Hall of Fame - 2022 Inductees

Steve Booker - Athlete

Steve attended Phillipsburg and Northmont High Schools from 1957 to 1960. During his time, Steve was a standout in both basketball and baseball. A three-year starter as a catcher, Steve won many awards. He was selected for the South Team in the All-State voting. Steve was an East-West selection All-Star and played in the district senior All-Star game. In basketball, he was the center on some very good teams. Steve earned multiple awards his junior and senior years. After selection to the Montgomery County All-Stars his junior year, he followed up with All-League and All Southwest Buckeye League. After high school, Steve played for Defiance College and had personal invitations from the Pittsburgh Pirates and the Milwaukee Braves organizations.



Tim Bookwalter - Athlete



During the 80s and 90s, Northmont Fencing was known throughout the State. One of the best fencers during this time was Tim Bookwalter. Tim fenced all four years for the team and competed on three State Championship teams during this time. As for individual awards, Tim accomplished a 4th place his senior year. Tim participated in Junior Olympics and was ranked 73rd in the nation. With his strong leadership skills, Coach Karen Emery named him Foil Captain in both his junior and senior years. Tim went on to The Ohio State University. His wife is Emily and they have two children: Gavin and Sophia.

Chris Burkhardt - Athlete

An athlete on the tennis court from 1984 – 1988, Chris Burkhardt was an excellent tennis player for the Northmont Thunderbolts. During her four years at Northmont, she earned her spot every year at the state tournament level. The highest Chris achieved was 3rd in the state. According to Coach Don Gillispie, "Chris is one of the reasons why I am in the Northmont HOF."



Alex Jones - Athlete



Northmont basketball in the early 2000s had a point guard that set the tone for future teams to emulate. Alex Jones was that person. To complement his leadership skills, Alex was voted as the captain of the 2001-2002 team as a junior. He was then selected to the 1st Team All-GWOC. Alex was also selected as a 1st Team All-District 9. During his senior year, again a two-time captain, Alex average 17.1 points per game. He again became 1st Team All-GWOC and 1st Team All-District 9. When he graduated, the Northmont Record Book was filled with his name: 1st in steals, 2nd in all-time assists, 4th in all-time scoring, and 6th in made 3-point shots. Alex continued his basketball career at Ashland and Shippensburg Colleges.

Crystal M. (Dunkle) Kinnaird - Athlete

When you think of Northmont softball, Crystal's name comes up as one of the best players in Northmont history. After moving to Northmont her sophomore year in high school, Crystal helped her team improve each year, culminating with the State Finals her senior year. While being a .361 hitter in her career, pitching is where the dominance occurred. Crystal accumulated some pitching stats that still hold today. In her senior year, she accomplished a 20-1 record, 0.41 ERA, 124 strike-outs, and 7 walks. Crystal threw two perfect games in one week! She was chosen 1st Team All-State, 1st team All-District, and All-League. She was the GMVC player of the year. After high school, she continued her career at the University of South Carolina and still holds records there as well. Crystal is an executive assistant for the 9th Coast Guard Commander and lives in Bay Village, Ohio.




Carrie Stallard - Athlete



A standout for the Northmont varsity softball teams since her sophomore year, Carrie was a three-time letter winner who took control of the games from day one. She is also the epitome of what a true leader is all about. From her sophomore year to her senior year, she was a two-time 2nd Team All-GMVC, a 1st Team All-League, All-State team, All-District, and 2nd Team All-State. Beside controlling the game behind the plate, she also batted .390 her junior year and .427 her senior year. Finally, to recognize her leadership, Carrie was a two-time nominatee for the Rae Burick Scholarship Award, and a recipient of the Archie Griffin Sportmanship Award. Her husband is John Adazzio. Her children are Samantha and Chris Dillon, Hannah and Evan Glover, Nolan Lawson and Dylan Lawson.





In 2011, the Northmont community passed a bond issue to build a much needed new high school and early learning center. The new high school was dedicated January 10, 2016 and was built around the existing auditorium which was completely renovated.
