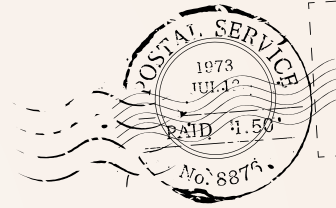

EAGLES RETURN TO THE NUTHOUSE

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A LEGACY THAT LIVES ON: THE WALNUT TENNIS FAMILY WELCOMES THE TRABERT FAMILY

On Sunday Aug 9, the Walnut Hills tennis family had the incredible honor of welcoming the family of one of the greatest athletes to ever walk the halls of Walnut Hills High School — Tony Trabert '48 — to the bubble.

It was more than a visit. It was a moment to celebrate history, legacy and the lasting impact one Eagle has had on the sport of tennis.

Before Tony Trabert became a Cincinnati sports legend, an international tennis champion and a household name, he was a Walnut Hills Eagle.

Trabert was a standout tennis player at Walnut Hills, where he went undefeated and established himself as one of Ohio's premier young players. He was a state doubles runner-up in 1945 before capturing the Ohio singles championship three consecutive years in 1946, 1947 and 1948.

From Walnut Hills, Trabert continued his career at the University of Cincinnati, where he became a two-sport standout. He won the 1951 NCAA Singles Championship, was a national doubles runner-up, and even played basketball for the Bearcats, serving as a starting guard on the 1951-52 team that competed in the National Invitation Tournament.

But his greatest chapters were still ahead.

Trabert went on to become one of the most accomplished American tennis players of his generation. His career included 10 Grand Slam championships — five in singles and five in doubles. He won the U.S. Championships twice, the French Championships twice and Wimbledon once in singles, along with five major doubles championships.

His 1955 season remains one of the greatest individual seasons in tennis history. Trabert won the French Championships, Wimbledon and U.S. Championships in the same year, becoming the world No. 1. He won 18 of the 23 singles tournaments he entered that season and finished with a remarkable 106–7 match record.

Trabert also represented the United States in Davis Cup competition from 1951–55, compiling a 26–8 record, and later served as U.S. Davis Cup captain. He led the American team to Davis Cup championships in 1978 and 1979.

His impact on tennis didn't end when his playing career did.

Trabert became one of the sport's most respected voices, spending more than three decades as a television broadcaster and analyst, most notably with CBS Sports, where he became synonymous with U.S. Open coverage. He later served as president of the International Tennis Hall of Fame from 2001–2011.

His contributions to the sport earned him induction into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1970, and his legacy continues to be honored throughout Cincinnati and at the University of Cincinnati.

Yet perhaps the most meaningful part of Tony Trabert's legacy isn't found in a trophy case or a record book.

It is found here.

On the Walnut Hills tennis courts.

In the generations of student-athletes who have picked up a racket, stepped onto these courts and learned the same lessons that tennis taught Tony Trabert — discipline, perseverance, competitiveness, sportsmanship and the importance of representing something bigger than yourself.

The Walnut Tennis family was honored to welcome the Trabert family back to the place where the journey began.

Thank you to the Trabert family for sharing this special moment with us and for carrying forward the legacy of a true Walnut Hills legend.

Tony Trabert's name is forever part of Walnut Hills history: and his legacy continues to live on in the heart of Walnut tennis.

Golden Eagle Pass

four adult passes good for ALL regular season games/events, \$500

Eagle Pass

two adult passes good for ALL regular season games/events, \$300

Blue Pass

one adult pass good for ALL regular season games/events, \$150

Nuthouse Pass

one student pass good for ALL regular season games/events, \$85

Eagles Seasonal Pass

one adult pass good for ALL regular season games/events for select season, \$100

Don't want to commit to a pass? No worries! Single tickets are available too. Single game tickets can be purchased online one (1) week prior to the sporting event, or at the gate via cash or card.
