Nevertheless, here is a list of Athletic Training Services unique to visiting student-athletes:

## Things I am permitted to provide

- Emergency care for life-threatening conditions
- Basic assessment and first aid for bumps, bruises, bleeding, and other acute injuries
- Preventive taping of un-injured body parts (**Please provide your own supplies**)
- Therapeutic/restorative taping and treatment <u>only</u> when a student-athlete has a note from a physician or physical therapist requesting this service (a note from your athletic trainer will not suffice— **Please provide your own supplies**)

## What I cannot provide

• If a student-athlete gets injured in the course of his/her participation at this school, I will <u>not</u> be able to provide therapeutic/restorative taping or treatment, nor make a return to play decision for that individual.
