



1964 BASKETBALL, TRACK

First-Team All League Varsity Basketball player his senior year.

Averaged 16.1 points per game, leading the Wildcats in scoring in all but three games his senior season.

Chosen Basketball Team MVP his senior year. Was Varsity League champion in the High Jump both his junior and senior years. He finished first in every dual meet during his senior season and set the school and league records at 6'4".

His high jump mark is still in the top 5 at LGHS 52 years later

Went on the University of Oregon where he played basketball and jumped for the Track team.

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1975 FOOTBALL, WRESTLING, BASEBALL

Starred as the quarterback on the football team where he won the J.P. Streepy Award as the teams MVP.


All League in Football.

In wrestling he won the CCS championship in his weight class, 175 pounds.

He finished 2nd in the WVAL but went on to win both the Region 3 title and CCS.

Awarded the Di Ferrari Award as the wrestling team's MVP.

Starting catcher and 2nd Team All League in baseball where he hit .323 his senior year and was voted the team's most inspirational player. Won the Panighetti Award as the Outstanding Senior Athlete.



1981 FOOTBALL, TRACK

First Team All CCS in football where he gained 1,317 yards and scored 13 touchdowns while playing in only 8 games due to injury.

Won the Streepy Trophy as the football team's MVP and was chosen WVAL MVP as well.

Won the Panighetti Award as the Outstanding Senior athlete.


WVAL League Champion in the 400 and anchored the 4x100 WVAL Champion Relay team as well as the 4x400 Relay team.

Track team Most Inspirational Award.

His 400 time is still third fastest in school history while his 100 and 200 times are still Top 10

Went on to play football at Santa Clara University where he was First team all Conference.

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


1986 FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, TRACK

Played 4 years of football, 3 on the Varsity, where he was named All-CCS strong safety his senior year and was All League both his junior and senior seasons.

Played on three league championship football teams and LGHS's first ever CCS champion. Was the leading rebounder on the Varsity basketball team both his junior and senior years where his junior season team again won a league championship.

Led the Los Gatos Track team in the High Jump and Triple Jump 3 years in a row, finishing 6th in CCS in the high jump. Still 6th on All-Time Triple jump list at 44'0" and 7th on All Time High Jump list at 6'2". Competed on two League Championship track teams.



1990 FOOTBALL, BASEBALL

First team All League and First Team All CCS in football his senior year.

Played strong safety, receiver and special teams, even kicking a field goal.

Played on two De Anza League and CCS champion football teams in 1988 and 1989.


Played four years of baseball, two as the starting catcher on the Varsity.

Played on a League Champion and CCS runner-up baseball team in 1989 and a league runner-up baseball team in 1990.

Starting catcher and lead-off hitter for the 1984 Los Gatos Little All-Star team that made it to Williamsport for the World Series.

Played football at UCSB as a strong safety.


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1993 SOFTBALL

The Pitcher on the only CCS Championship

softball team in LGHS history. In her senior season she was 24-4 with a 0.59 ERA while batting .389. Was varsity softball team MVP three consecutive seasons. Softball De Anza League MVP in 1993. Overall pitching record over three seasons for Los Gatos Varsity was 66 - 25. LGHS Senior Scholar Female Athlete 1993. Played four years of Varsity softball at Santa Clara University where she was 3 times SCU team MVP and a League MVP in 1995. She still holds SCU pitching records for most career wins, most shutouts, most complete games, most starts and most innings pitched. SCU Senior Scholar Athlete 1997.



1997 SWIMMING


CCS Champion in the 500 Free his junior season 1996 posting a school record time that still stands today.

At age 17 Jeremy swam at the Olympic trials placing 5th in the 1500 freestyle with the 10th fastest time in the world at the time.

As a senior he won both the 200 and 500 freestyle league and CCS championships and this time set the school's 200 yard record that also still stands today.

Overall he won 5 De Anza League championships and 3 CCS championships while earning All-American Awards 4 times. Went on to swim at Stanford University where he became one of a select few athletes to earn a full ride scholarship. His freshman year he was 2nd in the PAC-10 championships and 6th in the NCAA National Championships

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2002 CROSS COUNTRY, BASKETBALL, TRACK

All CCS First team Cross Country Runner her sophomore and junior seasons and MVP of the LGHS Cross Country team both years.


DAL Cross Country champion as a sophomore

setting 4 Course records during the season while winning 5 Invitational Meets.

MVP and Co-Captain of the Basketball team as

a junior and senior while leading the team in rebounds both years and scoring her senior season. She was twice named All League. Her junior year of Track she was on the 4x800 Relay team that finished first in the state and 2nd at the Indoor Nationals.

Senior year she ran a personal best 1600 of 5:06 which ranks 10th on the LGHS all time list LGHS female Scholar Athlete Award.



2003 BASKETBALL, TRACK


2003 State Discus Champion, winning by 13' 3" and missing the state record by 1" with the second best throw in California state history.

All-Time CCS Discus Record Holder – 204' 10".

2 Time Discus All American 2002 and 2003.
 Shot Put All American 2003
 3-time CCS champion, Discus 2002/2003 and Shot Put 2003.

Only thrower in school history to make the State Meet twice, also finishing 2nd in the Discus his junior year and 2nd at Nationals. Three times named Track team MVP. SCVAL ALL League Basketball player his senior season setting a school record for blocked shots (87) and grabbing over 50% of the team's total rebounds that season

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2004 VOLLEYBALL

Four-year starter Girl's Varsity Volleyball.
Her volleyball teams won 4 league
championships, 2 CCS championships and
were Nor Cal champs twice in 2000 and 2002.
De Anza League First Team All League three
consecutive years.

De Anza League MVP both her junior and senior seasons.

First team All CCS both her junior and senior seasons.

Played 4 years of college volleyball for Santa Clara University where she was named All Conference all four years.

Played on 2 WCC Championship teams at SCU.

Holds the Conference and SCU School record with a career total of 1,932 Digs.
