We hope to continue the level of excellence that tonight's inductees typify. Our inductees will be recognized with a magnificent trophy. Their names will be added to the banner hanging in the school's gym and the Hall of Fame plaque mounted in the lobby of the gym will also be engraved with their names.

We plan to begin shortly after tonight's proceedings with the selection of next year's class of inductees. The guidelines established by the committee require that 10 years pass from graduation at LGHS before a candidate becomes eligible for consideration. We hope to make the announcement for the Hall of Fame "Class of 2023" at the Alumni Reunion Football Game the last weekend of October 2022 and honor the group at a dinner ceremony on Saturday May 6, 2023. Please enjoy the evening as we recount the accomplishments and feats of some of the greatest Wildcat athletes in the long and storied history of Los Gatos High School.



### 1947 FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, TRACK, BASEBALL


Dick played on 5 SCVAL Varsity championship teams while at Los Gatos High.
He was the Streepy Trophy winner as the team MVP his senior year in football, where he also earned 2<sup>nd</sup> team All SCVAL honors.
His football teams both his junior and senior years won the league championship. He was named 1<sup>st</sup> team All SCVAL in basketball his senior year, playing on the second of his two league-champion basketball teams.
Dick finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the SCVAL in the hop, step

and jump helping the Track team to yet another league championship his senior year. He was also a starter on the baseball team.

### 1955 FOOTBALL, WRESTLING, TRACK, BASKETBALL,BASEBALL

Ted was an outstanding football and baseball player, wrestler and track star. He won the Panighetti Trophy as the outstanding senior athlete. Was team captain of the football team his junior year and team MVP his senior season. On the track he set a new SCVAL record with a broad jump of 21'8" to finish 1<sup>st</sup> in the SCVAL. He also finished 1<sup>st</sup> in the SCVAL and 2<sup>nd</sup> at Section 2 meet in the 75-yard dash. He qualified for North Coast State Track meet in both events and took 4<sup>th</sup> in the broad jump. Ted wrestled on the varsity team 3 years and was a two-year starter on the varsity baseball team, hitting in the middle of the order.

### 1971

### FOOTBALL, WRESTLING


Steve was an outstanding offensive and defensive lineman for a league championship team his junior year. He won the Elgin Martin Award as the team's outstanding lineman as a senior when he was chosen all league as a defensive lineman that season. Steve wrestled only his senior year where he was 19-1 with 10 pins, his only loss coming on a referee's decision at the NorCal state meet. He went on to West Valley and St. Mary's College where, as a senior, he was named Defensive Player of the Year while leading the Gaels in tackles and sacks. Steve was named to the All Northern California College Division 3 Team. He was signed by the Denver Broncos.

### 1980

### FOOTBALL, BASEBALL

Dave was named 1<sup>st</sup> team all league in football on both sides of the line of scrimmage. He was a 1<sup>st</sup> Team All WVAL running back and a 1<sup>st</sup> team All WVAL linebacker. He won the Streepy Trophy as the football team MVP his senior year and was also named the Most Inspirational Player. Baseball was his best sport, however. He was an outstanding pitcher and hitter and was twice named the MVP of the Wildcat baseball team. He earned 1<sup>st</sup> team All WVAL honors his senior season after compiling a 7-2 overall pitching record with an ERA of just 1.05. Dave struck out 44 batters in 47 innings pitched that season.

Bill played three years of Varsity football,
where he earned All DAL honors at center both his junior and senior seasons.
He was named 1<sup>st</sup> team ALL CCS center after his senior season, where he also garnered 1<sup>st</sup> team All DAL honors as a linebacker.
Bill wrestled his first three years at LGHS and finished 2<sup>nd</sup> at League Finals his junior year after placing 3<sup>rd</sup> his sophomore year. In Bill's senior year he concentrated on throwing events in Track and Filed, where he placed in the Top 8 at junior Nationals. He earned an athletic scholarship to the University of Washington as a thrower.



### Alli White Payne

### **VOLLEYBALL, BASKETBALL**

Alli was a three-year Varsity volleyball player, earning All League selections all three seasons.

Her junior and senior years she was also an All-CCS selection.

As a junior, she was part of the Wildcat's 1993 State Championship team and her senior season she led her team to the NorCal Finals. Her senior year she led the team in kills, digs and had 120 blocks while being named the team MVP.

Alli went on to a four-year volleyball career at the University of Oregon where she started all four seasons being named Freshman of the Year, earning All Pac 10 honors her junior and senior years as well as being named team captain and MVP her senior year.

She was selected League MVP her senior year and was an All-CCS selection 3 of her 4 years of varsity soccer.
Her teams made the CCS playoffs all four years and won a CCS championship her freshman season.


In baseball, Alex played all four years at the varsity level and was both an outstanding hitter and pitcher.

Caroline was an All-League Field Hockey player who led her team in scoring her senior year. She was also named All CCS 2<sup>nd</sup> team. Her junior and senior field hockey teams were CCS champions.

She has the 10<sup>th</sup> fastest 400 time in LG history. She was on the CCS Championship 4x400 relay in 2002 with the 4th fastest 4x400 in LG history.

She ran on 3 League Championship 4x400 relay teams in 2002, 2003, and 2004 and those 3 teams all qualified for the State Track meet. Her 4x400 relay was 12th in State in 2004. She was on a League Championship team in 2002, 2003, 2004.

Caroline played 2years of soccer and also was an outstanding tennis player.

### WATER POLO, BASEBALL

Kyle was an outstanding All League water polo player, but baseball was where he excelled. He was as dominant a pitcher as Los Gatos High School has ever seen. Kyle played on 3 SCVAL championship teams. Over his last two seasons, he was 22-3 with an ERA of 0.24 and 271 strikeouts against just 28 walks in 172 innings pitched. He was twice named the League MVP, was a 3-time All CCS player, including being named CCS Player of the Year in 2007. Kyle was named the San Jose Mercury News Athlete of the Year for 2006-07. He earned a scholarship to USD and was drafted by the LA Dodgers out of high school and the Cleveland Indians during college.
