Public School Student Eligibility Checklist

Y or N Does the student meet the Domicile Requirement? **One box below must be checked**

_____ Does the student live with the parent(s) who has primary legal custody in your district or specific attendance zone? Guardianship cannot be used to satisfy eligibility requirements.

- Did the student transfer to your school prior to June 1 before entering grade 7, 8, 9 or 10?
- Did the student attend your school or direct feeder school for the previous 365 days without withdrawing?
 - If the student is a new student to your school, did the student make a bonafide move into your district or specific attendance zone? see handbook
- Did the student return to their resident district within the first 11 days of either semester?
 - Does the student meet specific domicile requirements for situations involving divorce, legal separations, foreign exchange, virtual schools?

If a student is ineligible due to not meeting the domicile requirement, the student may be eligible for JV competition with a completed JV CSAP Form.

All below must be Yes in order for the student to be eligible to participate

- Y or N Did the student pass at least 4 academic classes last semester?
- Y or N Did the student have at least a 2.0 gpa last semester?
- Y or N Is the student enrolled in at least four academic classes?
- Y or N Is the student within the semester limit of 6 semesters of participation in grades 7-9 and 8 semesters of participation in grades 9-12?
- Y or N Is the student's 16th birthday after Aug 1 for Jr. High eligibility or 19th birthday after Aug 1 for Sr. High eligibility?
- Y or N If the student meets the domicile requirement by transferring, is a CSAP completed and on file with the AAA?
- Y or N Can the student participate without violating the same sport same season rule?
- Y or N Is the student an amatuer in the sport they are participating in?
- Y or N Is a completed participation consent form on file?
- Y or N Is an up to date physical exam form on file?
- Y or N Is the completed sports medicine fact sheet on file?
- Y or N Has the student's participation on non-school teams met the AAA requirements?
